FROM THE ORGANISING SECRETARY

We extend cordial welcome to all the delegates of the 34th All India Sociological Conference (27-29 Dec 2008), in the Pink City of Jaipur.

Please make note of the following things:

Weather: Carry good woollens as it would be really cold.

Venue: The venue of the conference is University of Rajasthan, Bapu Nagar, Jaipur. The Inaugural session will take place at Birla Auditorium, near Statue Circle from 10.00AM to 1.00 PM on 27th December, 2008.

Directions to reach the venue:

Railway Station- When you disembark at the station, please go to the main exit and look for counter/ banner of the conference. Taking an auto/ taxi from the station to

University campus, Bapu Nagar shall cost you an approximate fare of Rs 70-100. Pre-paid taxis are also available.

Bus Stand: There are two Bus stands – Sindhi Camp and Narain Singh Circle

Sindhi Camp (Main Bus Stand): Those arriving at Sindhi Camp should look for the Conference Counter/Banner in the main porch. Taking an auto/ taxi from Sindhi camp to University campus, Bapu Nagar shall cost you an approximate fare of Rs 70-100.

Narain Singh Circle: This stand is much closer to University so ask your bus conductor while boarding it. If the bus stops at **Narain Singh Circle**, please disembark there and look for the conference counter near the **Road over Escalators**. Auto/ rickshaw fare for University campus is approximately Rs 25-40.

Sanganer Airport: Please look for the Counter/ banner of Conference at the exit. Pre-paid taxis are available from airport to University campus for an approximate fare of Rs 200.

While arriving, if no one is at the counter please contact on the phone numbers given on the banner. Efforts are being made for transporting delegates from their ports of disembarkation on 26th Dec. only, however, at unearthly hour this arrangement may not be available (otherwise also, in some cases it may not be available), then please reach the Department of Sociology in the University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. On reaching the Campus proceed to Department of Sociology, Social Science Block and go to Registration/Accommodation Counter.

Accommodation: Once you reach the Department of Sociology go to the **Accommodation Counter** and they will guide you to the place of your stay. All the accommodation is booked till 29th night hence it has to be vacated by 9 A.M. on 30th December Morning. Anyone wishing to stay more would have to do so at his own expenses.
