## AWARDS / DISTINCTIONS OF MEMBERS

### ISS Lifetime Achievement Awards - 2010

The Indian Sociological Society has decided to felicitate the eminent sociologists **Prof. D.N. Dhanagare, Prof. T.K. Oommen and Prof. Suma Chitnis** for their significant contributions by presenting life time achievement awards at the 36 AISC at Cuttack.

#### ● Infosys Prize 2010

**Amita Baviskar**, Sociologist at Institute of Economic Growth, Delhi and **Nandini Sundar**, Chairperson of the Department of Sociology, Delhi School of Economics, Delhi University, both life members of the Indian Sociological Society, were declared joint winners of the **Infosys Prize 2010** for excellence in Social Sciences. While Prof. Baviskar won the prize for her work on Social Movements in Contemporary India, in Sociology Prof. Sundar was awarded the prize for her contribution to the understanding of social Identities in Social Anthropology. Nobel Laureate Amartya Sen headed the jury for the prize, which carries a cash award of Rs.50 lakh that will be shared by the two winners. The award ceremony will be held on 6 January 2011 in Mumbai where Prime Minister Manmohan Singh will present the awards to the winners. Both Nandini Sundar and Amita Baviskar are winners of the M.N. Srinivas Memorial Prize in 2002 and 2004.

#### ● Tamilnadu Scientist Award

**Dr. R. Shankar**, Professor and Head, Sociology Department, Bharathidasan University, Trichirappalli and Life Member of ISS, was awarded the **Tamilnadu Scientist Award – 2009** for his contribution in the social sciences by the Tamilnadu State Council for Science and Technology. The award was presented to him in October, 2010 at Chennai by the Higher Education Minister, Government of Tamilnadu.

#### ● Prof. M.N. Srinivas Memorial Prize

Prof. M.N. Srinivas Memorial Prize Committee has unanimously selected **Dr. Anindita Chakrabarti's** article entitled '*Judicious Succession and Judicial Religion: Internal Conflict and legal Dispute in Religious Reform movement in India.*' as the best paper for the Prize. The prize will be given to Dr. Anindita Chakrabarti Assistant professor, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT, Kanpur during the XXXVI AISC at Cuttack.

#### ● Prof. G.S. Ghurye Book Award for 2009

Prof. G.S. Ghurye Book Award for 2009 was awarded to **Prof. Ravindra K. Jain's** book "*Indian Transmigrants: Malaysian and comparative Essays*" by the Department of Sociology, University of Mumbai, Mumbai.

● **Dr. Sukant K. Chaudhury**, Associate Professor, University of Lucknow (Convenor RC-07, ISS) was nominated as Executive Member of the Board of RC-13, Sociology of Leisure of the ISA for a period of four years (2010 - 2014) in the recently concluded World Congress of Sociology at Gothenburg, Sweden in July 2010.

● **Prof. Hemixa Rao**, Prof & Head, Dept of Sociology, Sourashtra University, Rajkot and Life Member of ISS, has been appointed as Vice Chancellor of North Gujarat University, Pathan.

#### "U.G.C. SPONSORED NATIONAL SEMINAR ON GENDER EQUITY AND WOMEN EMPOWERMENT"

A two day U.G.C. sponsored National Seminar was organized by S.S.R.G. College for Women, Raichur (Karnataka) on the topic "Gender Equity and Women Empowerment" on 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> September 2010. Dr. J. Krishnamurthy, Professor of Sociology, Annamalai University, Annamalainagar, Tamilnadu, delivered the Key Note Address and Dr. Veerashekharappa, ISEC, Bangalore delivered a Special Lecture on "SHG-Bank Linkage - An Experience of Karnataka". In the two Technical Sessions of three Research Committees on SHGs and Women Empowerment (RC 1), Women and Health (RC2) and Women in Administration and Government Policies (RC 3), 76 Research Papers were presented. In all, 180 teacher, student and research scholar delegates participated in the Seminar. The Principal and Convener of the Seminar Smt. H. Sarojadevi delivered the Valedictory Address and Dr. Nataraju C. Associate Professor in Sociology was the Organizing Secretary."

#### REPORT OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE GUJARAT SOCIOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION

The annual conference of the Gujarat Sociological Association was organised by the Sociology Department, Sardar Patel University, Vallbh Vidyanagar on 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2010. Dr. John Jacob Kattakayam President, Indian Sociological Society inaugurated the Conference and he discussed the importance of regional level associations. In all 195 members (teaching faculty, research scholars and student delegates) have participated in the conference and presented research papers. The key speakers include Dr. Hemixa Rao, Vice Chancellor, Hemchandracharya University, North Gujarat, Dr. Harish Padh, Sardar Patel University, Vallbh Vidyanagar, Dr. Ramnik Bhatti, Dr. Ila Macwan, Dr. Chandrika Raval, Dr. Vidyut Joshi and Dr. Arjun Patel. Dr. Amrapali Merchant Professor and Head, Department of Sociology, Sardar Patel University was the organizing Secretary and Co-ordinator of this Conference.

#### REPORT OF THE NATIONAL SEMINAR ON "SUICIDES IN POST MODERN IN INDIA"

The Department of Sociology, S.K. University, Ananthapur, A.P. on its Silver Jubilee Year organized a two day National Seminar on "Suicides in Post Modern in India", during October 22 - 23, 2010. #### REPORT OF THE 37<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE KERALA SOCIOLOGICAL SOCIETY

Kerala Sociological Society organized its 37<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference at Farook College, Calicut from 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> November 2010. The theme of the conference was *Mobility, Mobilization and Social Development in a Globalized World*. Smt. Daya Bhai, the world renowned social activist inaugurated the conference, Prof. Sally Joseph, the President of Kerala Sociological Society, delivered the presidential address and Prof. Indira R., professor of Sociology and Director, International Center, Mysore University made the keynote speech. Prof. John Kattakayam, the President of Indian Sociological Society delivered the Valedictory Address. More than 325 delegates from various parts of the country attended the conference in which forty seven research papers spread over eight technical sessions, under four major subthemes were presented.

Loyola college of Social Sciences, Trivandrum and Farook College, Calicut won the Fr. Puthenkalam ever-rolling memorial trophy and Sr. Mary Ceicil ever rolling trophy for the for the best Dept. of Sociology among the postgraduate/M.Phil category, and the best Dept. of Sociology among the undergraduate category respectively. The winners of Prof. PKB Nair Award for the best paper presented in the Conference and Fr. Jose Murickan SJ award for the best paper published in the last three years were also awarded. The general body meeting held on 21<sup>st</sup> November elected Dr. Elizabeth Mathew, Head, Dept. of Sociology, Loyola College, Trivandrum, Sri. R.K Varghese, Head, Dept. of Soicology, S.H. College, Thevara, Ernakulam and Dr. Lekshmi V. Nair, Asst. Professor, IIST, Trivandrum as the President, Vice President and Secretary of the Kerala Sociological Society respectively for the next two years.

### IN MEMOIR

**Satish Saberwal**, formerly Professor of Sociology at the Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, passed away on 25 October 2010. An active member of the Indian Sociological Society and twice member of the Editorial Board of the *Sociological Bulletin*, he was 76 years of age, and leaves behind his wife Edith, daughter Gayatri and son Vasanth. Professor Saberwal did anthropological fieldwork among the Embu of Central Kenya (1962-63) and in Phagwara, an industrial town in Punjab, and later developed an avid and abiding interest in the comparative study of the historical experiences of Europe, India and China. He was a sociologist among historians and an historian among sociologists. His influential publications include many anthologies – *Process and Institutions in Urban India* (ed.); *Rules, Laws, Constitutions* (co-edited with H. Sievers); and *Social conflict* (co-edited with N. Jayaram) – and seminal original works – *Roots of Crisis: Interpreting Contemporary Indian Society*; *Wages of Segmentation*; and *Spirals of Contention: Why India was Partitioned in 1947*, for which he won The G. S. Ghurye Book Award for 2008. He was also associated with *Contributions to Indian Sociology (New Series)* in various capacities. Known for his erudite scholarship, impeccable professionalism, charming sense of humor and, above all, extraordinary warmth, we will miss Professor Saberwal.

**Prof. Madhav Sadashiva Gore**, former Chancellor of JNU and a Padma Bhushan awardee, died on November 19, 2010. He was 89. He was an active member of ISS and served as its President during 1982-83. Born on August 15, 1921, he had his education in Dharwad, Pune and Sangli. He had his PG Diploma in Social Service Administration from TISS. He received his Master's degree in Sociology from the University of Bombay in 1948 and later obtained his Ph.D. from Columbia University, USA in 1961.

Dr. Gore served in several educational institutions. He served as the Director of TISS till 1982. He was the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Bombay from 1983 to 1986 and Chancellor of JNU during 1997 – 2002. He was a visiting Fulbright Professor in the University of Wisconsin, USA during 1960-1961. Prof. Gore is known for his scholarship and simplicity. He was honored with a Special Award by the Indian Council of Social Welfare. He became a recipient of the Padma Bhushan Award in 1975. In 2006 he received Life Time Achievement Award from the Indian Sociological Society for his contribution to Indian Sociology.
