## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



We are well into the second half of 2022 and I take this opportunity to highlight some of the activities undertaken by the Indian Sociological Society (ISS) in the last four months (May-August), and a few that are in the pipeline this year. First and foremost, I am glad to inform you that the Indian Sociological Society in collaboration with the Islamic University of Science and Technology (IUST), Awantipora, Kashmir (J&K) is organizing a two-day International Conference (Hybrid) at IUST on 6th-7th September 2022. The President of the International Sociological Association (ISA), Prof. Sari Hanafi will deliver the Keynote Address (online) and the Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) will be the Chief Guest. Delegates from different countries and from all over India will attend the Conference and present papers in different Technical and Plenary sessions. Amid the turmoil of pandemic and conflict around the world, it is hoped that this conference will not only provide a platform for academic interactions but a space for bringing people together to discuss issues of 'Society, Culture and Social Change: Kashmir and Beyond' in a beautiful place of our country -Kashmir!

The RC Conveners and Managing Committee meetings will also be held in Srinagar on the 5th and 6th of September 2022 respectively. I am happy to note that despite the Hybrid option, a significant number of members would be coming to Kashmir and attending the meetings physically. It is heartening to note that the RCs have been active during this period and organized different activities, the reports of which are included in this issue of the E-Newsletter. A meeting (online) of Regional Associations (RAs) with the MC Members was held on 4th June 2022 in which 13 Regional Associations participated and the representatives presented their reports. It was nice to know that some new Regional Associations have been formed. The issues of collaboration of RAs with ISS, formation of Council of Regional Associations, networking, increasing membership, fee structure, website, etc. were discussed.

The announcement of the 47th All India Sociological Conference has been made and the preparations for the Conference have started with its brochure and flyer out for dissemination of information. The Conference will be held at the University of Science and Technology Meghalaya (USTM) from 20th -22nd December 2022. The theme of the Conference is Hundred Years of Sociology in India: Exploring Trajectories for the Future. A Workshop for Young Researchers will also be held on the 18th and 19th of December at IIT Guwahati (Assam). In the meanwhile, online meetings of various Committees as part of preparations were held, besides those with the Website team, and the Editor, Office Bearers, and Publishers of the Hindi Journal (18th August 2022). The second issue of the Journal Sociological Bulletin and the first issues of Bharatiya Samajshastra Sameeksha (Hindi Journal) and Explorations (E-Journal) are also out. I am grateful to all ISS and MC members in whatever capacity they are working, for their unflinching support and cooperation. I am thankful to Prof. Manish K. Verma, the Editor of the Newsletter, Prof. Ajailiu Niumai, the Co-editor, the Members of the Editorial Board, and the Office Secretary, ISS for their efforts.

# REPORTS OF THE ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES FROM MAY TO AUGUST 2022

#### NATIONAL SEMINAR

RC-10 (Gender Studies) and RC-26 (Minority Studies) in collaboration with the Department of Sociology, University of Science & Technology, Meghalaya (USTM) successfully organized a two-day national seminar on "Minority Rights and Gender Justice in India: A Qualitative Study on Academic & Social Policy" on 22-23 July 2022. The seminar was sponsored by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) - North Eastern Regional Centre, Shillong. In the inaugural function, Prof. G.D. Sharma, Hon'ble VC of USTM, and Prof. A.C. Talukar, Dean USTM welcomed the guests and made an excellent speech. The Keynote address was delivered by Prof. Arvinder A. Ansari from Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi. The Guest of Honour was Prof. Shweta Prasad from Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi and Prof. Ajailiu Niumai from the University of Hyderabad, Hyderabad. Dr. Trishna Thakuria, Organising Secretary of the seminar, Dr. Rajni Bala, Convenor of RC-10, Dr. Imtiaz Ahmed Ansari, Convenor, RC-26 and Dr. Kughatoli V Aye, HoD, Department of Sociology, USTM also addressed the delegates. In the afternoon session which was chaired by Prof. Pranjal Sharma, Dr. Bhup Singh, Dr. K.M Ziyauddin, Dr. Rajni Bala and Dr. Imtiaz Ahmed Ansari made their presentations in the Panel Discussion on the theme 'Gender Equality & Minority Rights in India: Voices from the Field'. Four technical sessions were also organised during the seminar in which delegates presented their papers. Prof Abha Chauhan, President, ISS and Prof Manish Verma, Secretary, ISS could not join the conference. Many distinguished scholars from Jamia Millia Islamia, University of Hyderabad, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, IIT Guwahati, Banaras Hindu University and many other scholars from different institutions participated and deliberated in it. The seminar concluded with a vote of thanks by the organizing secretary Dr. Trishna Thakuria.









#### LECTURE SERIES

The Lecture Series on Gender and Inclusion in the Centre for the Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy (CSSEIP), Banaras Hindu University (BHU) was organised by Prof. Shweta Prasad, Director, CSSEIP, BHU. The inaugural lecture of the Series on Gender and Inclusion was delivered by Prof. Vibhuti Patel, Vice-President of the Indian Association for Women's Studies. The Valedictory session was organized on 16th August 2022 as a webinar where Prof. Abha Chauhan, President, Indian Sociological Society delivered the Keynote Address and Prof. R. Indira, Former President, Indian Sociological Society and Prof. Manish K. Verma, Secretary, Indian Sociological Society were the Guests of Honour. Other speakers of the Series included Prof. Tulsi Patel, Prof. Nilika Mehrotra, Prof. Ajailiu Niumai, Prof. Rajesh Gill, Prof. Bula Bhadra, Prof. Rekha Pande and Dr. Rajni Bala.

## SPECIAL LECTURE SERIES OF THE NORTH EAST INDIA SOCIOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION (NEISA)

North East India Sociological Association (NEISA) organised its first Online Special Lecture Series on 18th August 2022. The distinguished speaker Prof. T. K. Oommen spoke on "Exclusion and Inclusion of the North East Region". Prof. Tiplut Nongbri chaired and Prof. Chandan Kumar Sharma welcomed everyone and highlighted the background formation of NEISA. Prof. Ajailiu Niumai introduced the speaker. Many Universities and colleges from North East India including some senior faculty from different parts of the country joined NEISA's Online Lecture Series through live streaming in which a total number of around 1000 people attended the lecture. Prof. T. K. Oommen explained that the term social exclusion is of relatively recent origin, which was first coined by Rene Lenoir in 1974. He distinguished the conceptual difference in the usage of the term exclusion, and how it focuses on individuals in Western society whereas it refers to the exclusion of lower caste communities in India. As a result, the application of inclusion was reflected in the implementation of reservation policies for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe (SC/ST) in India. He said that reservation is a strategy for including the excluded castes and tribal groups.

He asserts that North East India is not entirely populated by any groups but there are many tribal-dominated areas. He opines that the prevailing exclusion and processes of inclusion would vary in such areas. The tribal people are excluded by most, and in these tribal states, the caste hierarchy is technically absent while not denying its presence in a few states like Assam, Manipur, Sikkim and Tripura. If the North East is referred to as a region, inclusion and exclusion would mean different things. For example, there is no caste system in Nagaland, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram. We, therefore, have to construct the region sociologically first and then think in terms of appropriate measures of exclusion and inclusion with careful note. While we can see women and their establishment in the market, there are hardly any women political leaders in the State Legislative Assembly. It shows that there is a serious deficit in political power, and it fundamentally affects women or the excluded. Even within the region, there are clear distinctions between the tribes, the Adivasi and Hindus. Therefore, internal differences within North East India have to be recognized if the process of inclusion has to be introduced. The region itself has to be differentiated as the global differentiation of even rural and urban cannot be easily applicable in the Indian context. He insists that North East India is not a sociological entity, although it is treated in India as an administrative entity, as Nehru referred to it as North East India Frontier Agency (NEIFA). He said that the other misconception about North East India is that it is perceived as a den of the tribal secessionist movement, inspired by Christian missionaries and supported by tribal anti-nationals. He emphasized that there are prejudices that existed and still exist in India regarding some national movements for self-determination in North East India. But, sociologists and social anthropologists have not analyzed it. He hope that the sociologists located in North East India would decipher these prejudices in the region in particular and in India, which is a spill-over of the upper caste Hindus and the administrators. He asserts that it is the responsibility and disciplinary task of sociologists and social anthropologists to do away with it. Prof. R.K. Mohanty delivered the vote of thanks and expressed his heartfelt gratitude to everyone who joined and made it a grand success.











## REPORTS OF ISS JOURNALS

## REPORT OF THE MANAGING EDITOR, SOCIOLOGICAL BULLETIN (Journal of the Indian Sociological Society)

- 1. Currently Sociological Bulletin is publishing its 71st volume since January 2022. Three regular issues of this volume have already been published and the special issue (October December) on "New farm bill and farmers resistance to neoliberalism" which is being edited by Satendra Kumar will be released soon. Many articles on this issue are already available online. While the first issue (January-March) of the 71st volume contained eight articles and four book reviews, the second issue (April-June) carried six articles including Prof. Yogendra Singh Memorial lecture delivered at the 46th AISC and three book reviews. There are seven articles and three book reviews in the third issue (July-September).
- 2. From 08th March 2022 (report up to 7th March 2022 was presented in the last MC meeting) to 31st August 2022, we have received 71 submissions. Of these, while nine articles were accepted for publication 28 articles were rejected, 11 articles are under editorial assessment and the remaining articles are at different stages of evaluation. As many as 14 articles were not considered for publication, as they fell short of the required word limit of at least 5000 words. Accepted nine articles and seven book reviews (till 31st of August) are lined up for publication in 2023.
- 3. From 8th March 2022 to 31st August 2022, we received 14 books for review.
- 4. The special issue for 2023 on "Education in Contemporary India: Inequality, Exclusion and Marginality" will be edited by Dr. Anurekha Chari Wagh and Prof. Aparna Rayaprol.
- 5. The Editorial Board and Editorial Advisory Committee have been reconstituted and the cover page of the Sociological Bulletin has been redesigned from the second issue of the 71st volume (2022).
- 6. Sociological Bulletin has migrated from earlier email-based operations to Sage online peer-review and submission system since May 2022. Now all submissions and review reports are accepted only through the Sage online portal.

- 4. The participants retreated that there is a need to organize workshops on academic and methodological academic writing in the Hindi-speaking areas to motivate young scholars to write a good academic paper for the journal.
- 5. Few members suggested that we should increase the individual and institutional membership. And, there can be a separate subscription rate for students so that subscription numbers can be increased,
- Members also suggested that MC members should help so that individual and institutional subscriptions can be increased.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks.

## **FORTHCOMING EVENTS IN 2022**

- 1.KARNATAKA SOCIOLOGY ASSOCIATION is organizing the 14th National Sociology Conference on the 9th and 10th of November 2022. Department of Sociology, Kuvempu University, Shimoga, is hosting the conference on the theme "Reconstructing Society in Post Covid 19 India Challenges and Opportunities for Sociology", with the following Sub-themes:
- a) Impact of Covid 19 on Family, Education, and Work Life.
- b) Covid 19 and the Marginalisation of special Groups Sexual Minorities, Elderly, and Disabled.

#### 2. NATIONAL SEMINAR

Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC), RC - 10 Gender Studies of Indian Sociological Society and Centre for Women's Studies Centre, Bangalore University is organizing a National Seminar on 'Women Leadership in Decentralised Government', on November 3-4, 2022 at Bengaluru.

The theme of the workshop is, 'Use and Relevance of Mixed Methods in Sociological Research.' The ISS is inviting researchers and doctoral students, below 35 years of age on 1st December 2022 to apply for participation in the workshop.

## 4. ONLINE LECTURE PROPOSED BY THE RC-26 (MINORITY STUDIES)

Title: Adivasiaization of the Discourse: A Study on the Presence of Muslims in the Jharkhand Movement
