Greetings to Esteemed Members of ISS!



A TRIBUTE FROM ISS



Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji (1940-2021)

With a deep sense of grief, the Indian Sociological Society (ISS) informs the sad news of the demise of Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji around 11 pm on 12th February, 2020 at his residence in Delhi.

As a mark of respect to the departed soul, the ISS presents the following as it's gratitude to the eminent service rendered by him to Indian Sociology and his contribution to the profession.

Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji was born in Gaya (3rd September, 1940) and began his career as a research scholar at the Gandhian Institute of Studies, Varanasi (1962-63). He taught at Patna University (1963-1970); served for a brief period as a Research Scientist at the Indian Statistical Institute, Kolkata (1967-68); then moved over to the Centre for Advanced Studies, Department of Sociology, Delhi

School of Economics, Delhi University (1970-72). He joined the Centre for the Study of Social Systems, Jawaharlal Nehru University in the year and the first batch of students at the Master's level was given admission. On being invited by the Indian Statistical Institute, Kolkata, he joined as Professor in 1980 and subsequently moved over to its Planning Unit at New Delhi in December 1983. In 1996 he became the Director/Vice Chancellor of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai. Later The Council for Social Development, New Delhi, offered him the position of Director, which he joined in November 1999. In 2001 he accepted the Senior Fellowship of the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library and continued till September 2003 until he was invited to accept the S. K. Dey Chair instituted by the Ford Foundation at the Institute of Social Sciences, New Delhi. Finally, after six years (September 2009), he decided to work on his own. Recently, in September 2011, the Institute honoured him with the status of Professor Emeritus (Honorary), as a mark of appreciation of his valuable services to the Institute, which he gladly accepted.

Books authored/edited by him include From Left Extremism to Electoral Politics (1983),

Indian Sociology: Reflections and Introspections with T. K. Oommen (1986), People's Rights: Social Movements and the State in the Third World with Manoranjan Mohanty (1998), Sociology in South Asia: Heritage and Challenges with Jacob Aikara, Chandan Sengupta (1998), Methodology in Social Research (2000) and Indigeneity and Universality in Social Science: A South Asian Response with Chandan Sengupta (2004)


His areas of research interest include: social movements (including Gandhian and Maoist movements and peasant movements); gender concern; democratic decentralization; research methodology; sociology of rural labour, international migration. He was the Prime Minister's nominee to the Advisory Board, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, New Delhi, (1999-2002); served as Member, Council of Scientific and Industrial Research Technology Awards Selection Committee (2000-2002).

His service as Secretary (1988-89) and President (2004-05) in our ISS was distinctive in every respect to make it a professional and world-renowned organization of Indian Sociologists.

Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award of the Indian Sociological Society in 2013. He will be long remembered for his seminal role in reinventing, reorienting and modernizing Indian Sociology as a popular subject of study and profession.

As a person, Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji was simple, humble, amiable, humane and disciplined in nature. His death is the culmination of an era in Indian Sociology and ISS has lost a first-generation pioneering sociologist which has created a vacuum. Indian sociologists will remain indebted to the epoch-making contributions of Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji.

Accordingly, Indian Sociological Society salutes the great sociologist Prof. Partha Nath Mukherji, who will remain with us always in our thoughts and deeds.

REPORTS ON CONFERENCES/SEMINARS

A Two-day National Webinar on the theme "Social Transformation and Development" by the Research Committee 15 of Indian Sociological Society from 12th April to 13th April 2021.



The Inaugural Session began with lighting a diya. Prof. N. K. Bhargava, Seminar Director, welcomed all the participants of this online National Seminar. With the new nomenclature "Social Transformation and Development" he expected the RC-15 would take up new challenges, new ideas and emerging phenomena prevalent in today's society. In the current social-reality there has been transformation in every aspect. Being confident on the capability of RC15 for bringing out existing social transformation and new transformations taking place, he hoped that the National Seminar would come out with new ideas to society and set agenda for others, with a view to benefit the emerging society.

The Keynote address was delivered by Prof. R. Indira, Former President ISS. She started with the relationship between the concepts of transformation and that of development. Social transformation is a continuous and ongoing

process linked to change and is inevitable in society. Transformation makes the 'new normal' to 'normal now'. It is generally associated towards change for betterment. Development is ultimate aim of transformation and refers to better physical, economic and social environment. development, the human beings to have basic minimum necessities of life available to them. The levels of developments also change with time. No society is fully developed as developed societies have under developed pockets. Similarly, under developed societies have developed pockets. She also differentiated between growth, a qualitative indicator of change, with development that talks about distribution of benefits of growth. As we are living in the unequal world having significant marginalization, the sociology to be more concerned about equity i.e reality of equal rights to all. She concluded that while transformation and development are interrelated, development to be seen as inclusion, as equity, as human rights and as entitlement.

The Chief Guest Prof. Jagan Karade, Secretary ISS, while acknowledging RC 15 as a big and active, gave credit to the convener, both former and present, and its members for its success. He stated that concept of transformation came after World War II when two models of development viz. Marxist Revolution Model and Modernization Model grew. In India the majority groups and classes are normally dominating and use their authority to get benefits. Minority communities dominate in certain areas only. As per his vision

the perspective of development should cover social and political aspects also and not only economic aspect. He considered the current nomenclature "Social Transformation and Development" as more real and relevant. He urged the participants to focus on beneficiaries of development, development perspectives, sustained development, subaltern perspectives of development and analysis of effect & impact of development.

A book of RC 15 for the session 2021 was released during the session. The session ended with vote of thanks by Dr. Ashutosh Vyas, Convener RC15, to all the distinguished speakers and participants. The session was coordinated by Mr. Sandeep Sharma, Chittorgarh. Rapporteur was provided by Ms. Soma Roy, Kolkata and Technical support by Mr. Rajendra Menaria.

Post lunch, Technical Session I "Development and Change" was started. Prof. Anurekha Chariwagh from Central University, Hyderabad chaired the session. Prof. D. K Singh from BHU, Varanasi and Prof Sampat Kale, TISS, Mumbai co-chaired the technical session. A total of 18 papers were presented online. Several deliberations and confluence of ideas made the entire session interesting and interactive. A vote of thanks was extended to the dignitaries by Dr. Prabhas Kumar and Dr. N Barot. The session was coordinated by Dr. H Mahawar.

Day 2: Day 2 of the National webinar began with the Panel Discussion. A total of 4

distinguished panelists were invited to project their ideas and observations on a variety of topics related to social transformation and development. Dr Sudeshna Parija coordinated the session.

The 1st speaker was Prof. B. K. Nagla who talked about social and sustainable development. He discussed about the advancement of social capital, harmony, liberalism, social goods etc. that would ensure human and social welfare and justice. He also threw light on growth for whom, growth for what and growth at what cost. He briefly apprised about the various perspectives and imperatives.

The 2nd panelist was Prof S.C Rajora. He explained about social transformation and development in a lucid manner. He defined social transformation as the process of alteration and focused upon the transformation of social status. Putting things in perspective, he touched upon the ongoing pandemic and the relevance of sociology to underline changes that are occurring in the institutions.

The next speaker was Prof. Abdul Shahban. Prof Abdul discussed about the observations he had made with special reference to the Indian society. From the rise of the neo middle class to the decline of Dalit movement to the merging of the Left and the Right wings, to transformations among the Muslim community to the adaptation by the minorities, his discussion sheltered the nitty- grities of the societal transformation. He also deliberated on a concept known as social

fencing along with it highlighted the mentality of the youth.

Prof Sangeeta Pandey was the final panelist who engaged the participants with her notions revolving around transformational adaptation, an idea borrowed from Talcott Parsons. In the light of the contemporary scenario Prof. Pandey stressed on the development of indigenous models that could be used to find solutions pertaining to Indian society. She also emphasized on fundamental changes brought out in theory, practice and policy making.

Towards the end of the session, the panel opened for the participants to raise queries and discussed issues with the panelists. The session ended with vote of thanks by Dr. Vikas Kumar to all the distinguished panelists and participants.

Post panel discussion, Technical Session II on the topic "Social Transformations in Contemporary Issues" commenced. The session was chaired by Prof B N Prasad, A N Sinha Institute, Patna and Prof. Chura Giri from Assam and Prof. D K Singh as the Co- Chairs. A total of 11 papers were presented by the participants connecting virtually from almost all corners of the country. The papers were reviewed by the Chair and were given suggestions. The session was coordinated by Dr. Suchitra Sharma. The session ended with a vote of thanks from Dr. Mamta Gavshindhe.

The Valedictory session began with the Convenor, Dr. Ashutosh Vyas's welcome address. The report of the webinar was read by Dr. Tanmay Sharma.

Mr. Ashish Vijay, Guest of Honour, Principal, Neerja Modi School, Chittorgarh congratulated the entire team of RC-15 for successfully organizing the webinar. He also praised the participants' and paper presenters who connected from various parts of the nation and contributed their ideas and researches. The valedictory address was given by the Chief Guest, Prof. D.S. Rajput. He pondered over the social situation that the pandemic has given birth to. He deliberated that people are going through stress which is affecting their mental health. To avoid that level of chaos in the society, sociologists need to device and find solutions to problems like these, he added. He also laid stress on both, formal and informal education and the role that social institutions in the overall smooth functioning of the society. Prof. N.K. Bhargava, while chairing the session remarked that it becomes the responsibility of the sociologists to contribute to solve the issues and challenges that the society faces, only then the relevance of the discipline could be justified. The vote of thanks was given by Prof. B.N. Prasad towards the end of the session. The session was coordinated by Dr. Shruti Tandon.

A total of 108 participants connected virtually and several deliberations were held on social transformations and development.

The technical support was headed by Mr. Sandeep Sharma, Mr. Rajendra Menaria and Shailendra Tailor for all the technical sessions.


Late Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Endowment Lecture for the Academic Year 2020 – 2021.



The Department of Sociology, University of Madras, Chennai has organized Late Mahatma Jyotirao Phule Endowment Lecture for the Academic Year 2020–2021, on 11th January 2021, on the theme Contributions of Mahatma Jyotirao Phule to National Development, which was delivered by Prof. Jagan Karade, Secretary, Indian Sociological Society (ISS), Professor and Head, Department of Sociology, Shivaji University, Kolhapur.

In the initial stage Dr. M. Thamilarasan Associate Professor and Head I/c Department of Sociology, University of Madras, Chennai welcomed the speaker, faculty members and participants. Dr. Karade has given an apparent insight to the contemporary relevance of the doctrine of late Mahatma Jyotirao Phule through his exemplary lecture. Though the ideas and contributions of

Mahatma Jyotirao Phule has been connected with holistic national development with regard to the key areas of development like education, women and children, equality, justice, empowerment of women, development of marginalized and weaker sections of society, it is considered through parochial view. The speaker has highlighted that no longer one can understand the contributions of Mahatma Jyotirao Phule in parochial dimension. The speaker has emphasized that without the development of individual, marginalized, women and children and weaker sections of the society, national development will not be possible and made realistic. Leaders and authorities who drive to contribute for the national development have to understand the real interests and demands of the people from their perspective. Hence, the bottomup approach and model of development are mandatory at present. It will be strengthened to have over all grassroots level development. Mahatma Jyotirao Phule has considered education as the prime tool for the upliftment of downtrodden through which the values of society and skills needed for the people of marginalized groups, weaker sections and downtrodden could be inculcated.

Odisha Sociological Society holds General Body Meeting was conducted through Virtual Mode



indices, databases, etc., to guide them regarding their career opportunities and to promote and develop students' capacity of research and give them information of the current updated knowledge.




